Funding to Watch

-Federal. The EPA Community Change Grant

The EPA CCG grant opened on November 21, 2023 (\$2B on a rolling basis). Funding is available to support community-driven projects that build capacity for communities to tackle environmental and climate justice challenges, strengthen their climate resilience, and advance clean energy. NOFO: [Link](#) Climate resiliency and adaptation, Mitigating climate and health risks from extreme heat, wood heater emissions, and wildfire events, Community-led air and pollution monitoring, prevention, and remediation, Investments in low- and zero-emission and resilient technologies and related infrastructure, Workforce development that supports the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and other air pollutants, Reducing indoor toxics and indoor air pollution, Facilitating the engagement of disadvantaged communities in state and federal advisory groups, workshops, rulemakings, and other public processes.

-Federal. The EPA Environmental and Climate Justice Block Grant

The Environmental and Climate Justice Block Grant program will provide funds to help underserved communities improve health and well-being by addressing air pollution; increasing resilience to extreme heat, wildfires, and other climate risks; and reducing indoor air pollution. The program will seek to address community needs holistically, intersecting transportation, energy, climate resilience, and indoor air quality needs.

For example, funding a community's integrated plan for electric buses, solar arrays, and home decarbonization projects would simultaneously improve indoor and outdoor air quality, reduce greenhouse gasses, and increase resilience to electric power shutoffs due to wildfire risks. The funding provides a phased approach, with initial grants for capacity-building, needs assessment, and planning, and subsequent grants for implementing the planned projects. The program will be modeled after [California's Transformative Climate Communities](#) grant. The SGC will provide our Climate Collaborative with technical assistance to apply, in partnership with the Milken Institute.

-State. Extreme Heat and Community Resilience Program

Extreme heat will impact every community in California and is a public health, climate resilience, and social equity problem. Climate change is causing more frequent and severe consecutive, unusually hot days and nights – known as extreme heat events. Small/large planning grants, and small/large implementation grants will be awarded to assist communities with placemaking, and infrastructure, to help.

Technical Assistance ([link](#))

1. **Facilitation:** effective methods for guiding meetings, active listening, convening support, achieving consensus, conflict resolution and mediation
2. **Collaborative governance:** practices of collaboration and communication between multiple partners, including shared decision-making frameworks, charters and bylaws
3. **Partnership Models:** strategies for leveraging and sustaining the work over the long-term with multiple partners (e.g., government, community-based organizations, anchor institutions, tribal and non-tribal serving organizations)
4. **Community Engagement:** methods for supporting collaborative work with community members, developing shared language, and ensuring accessibility for Limited English Proficiency (LEP) individuals
5. **Climate Communications:** narratives, framing, and messaging strategies for communicating about climate change
6. **Racial Equity and Environmental Justice trainings:** applying a racial equity lens to local and regional climate mitigation, adaptation, and resiliency efforts
7. **Sustainable Funding:** strategies to build sustainable funding structures (not grants) that advance local and regional climate goals, including the development of private/public partnerships and non-traditional funding and financial models
8. **Grant support:** identification of public and private grants support climate collaboratives, grant administration, and grant tracking.
9. **Climate Workforce and Equitable Economic Development:** strategies for advancing State and local climate mitigation, adaptation, and resilience objectives, supporting and developing career-path jobs, mitigating displacement
